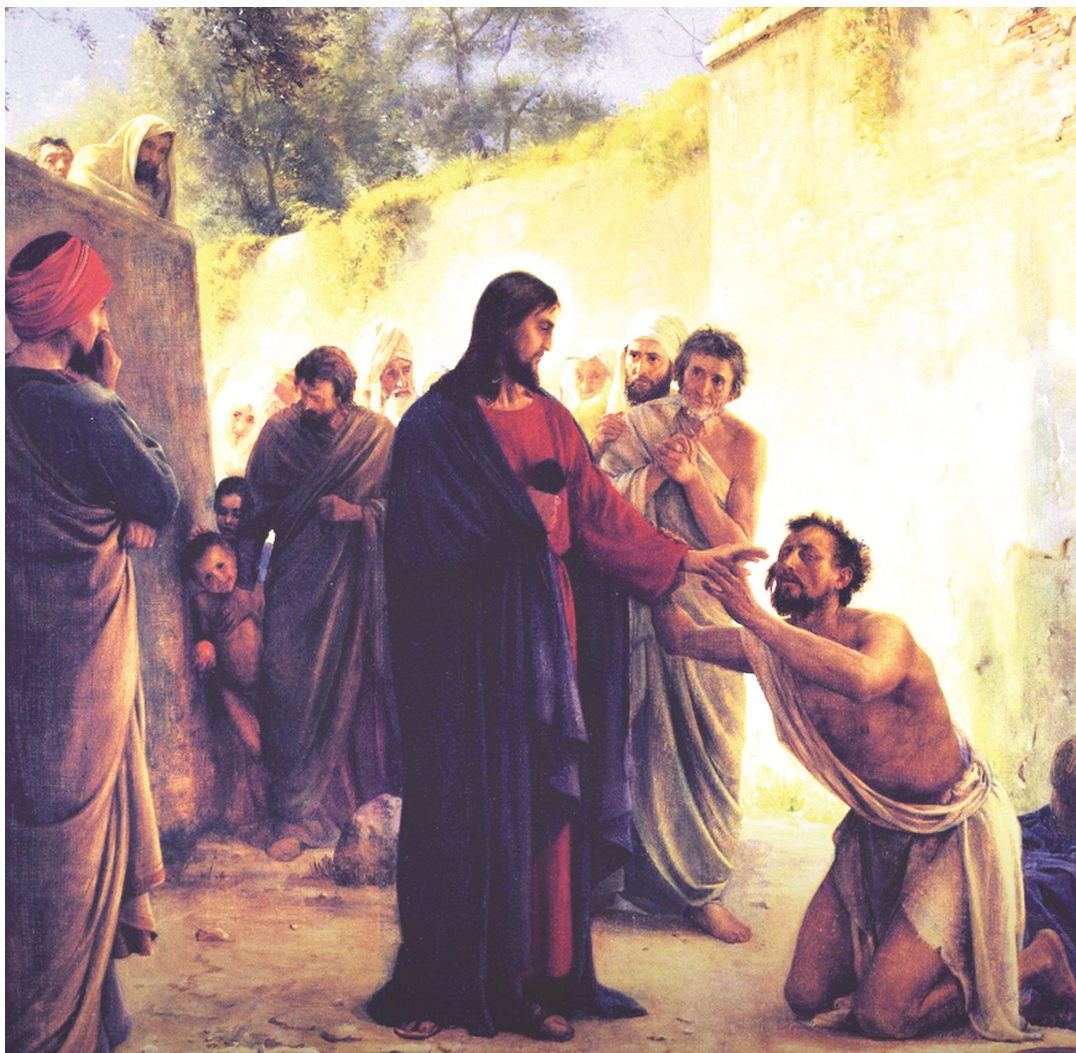

FROM THE DESK OF FR. ALFONSE...



Believing is seeing. We have all heard the saying, "Seeing is believing." Well today, the Lord is turning our visual world upside down (that is, right-side up) by saying "Believing is seeing."

A long time ago, I attended a wedding in which a beautiful blind young lady married a not-so-attractive young man. As I child, I was puzzled. She was beautiful. He was unattractive. Why in the world would she

ever marry a guy like that? It took me about twenty years to understand. He loved her and she loved him. She knew him the best way you can know anyone: by heart.

Conditioned by sight. Having sight is an amazing gift, but it can also be an awful handicap. It can get in the way of getting to know people.

Those who are visually impaired have an advantage over those who are not. They don't live by appearances, so they take their time getting to know someone. They don't judge on sight. They see and learn through the heart. I know you by heart.

The Lord wants to turn our world right-side up. He wants us to start judging not by appearances but by the heart. He knows us. He knows us well. And He knows we tend to see things for what they appear to be, rather than as they really are.

He knows how appearances can heavily (and negatively) influence our conclusions. He knows how we can judge rich people as happy people or poor people as miserable people. He knows how we can be seduced into believing that actors are knowledgeable people; or that attractive people are amazing or lucky people; or that professors and/or priests are boring people. He knows how we can equate great speakers as great leaders. He knows, to our embarrassment, how easily we can judge others based on the color of their skin. How wrong of us. And we can blame some of it on our sight.

"Believing is seeing." This is absolutely true. And I have come to see things in my life only because I first believed in them. This isn't novel. This is a part of our reality. "Believing is seeing" happens all

the time. It happened when man landed on the moon. Didn't we first imagine it? It happened when wireless communication became a reality. Wasn't Gene Roddenberry the first to envision it? It happened with light sabers. Didn't George Lucas design them before scientists ever got to work on them? The day we stop believing new things will be the day we stop seeing new things.

The key to knowing God is through the heart. When it came time for the prophet Samuel to pick a King for Israel, he went to Jesse's home to pick one out. As he looked for the tallest and most dashing boy, the Lord spoke to him, saying, Be careful, Samuel. Be careful. "Do not judge from his appearance or from his lofty stature, because I have rejected him. Not as man sees does God see, because man sees the appearance but the Lord looks into the heart" (Samuel 16:6-7).

In the end, the youngest son, David, was picked...and the rest is history.

Turning things right-side up. All of us have had positive and negative experiences. And although past experiences do not change, our understanding of them do. And so what we once judged to be a negative experience, may be something positive today; and what we once thought was a positive experience, may actually have been the start of something horribly negative.

"Awake, O sleeper, and arise from the dead, and Christ will give you light" (Eph. 5:14). Awake! is another way of saying "Open your eyes!"

The best way to get to know someone is through the heart, not by our senses or by reading about them. That's why so many people believe in God, regardless of how different our "bibles" may be. They can have a real experience of Him through the heart. And as you can imagine, it's much harder to get to know people than it is to get to know God. After all, God does not change. WE DO, and do so constantly. Let's just hope we are constantly hanging for the better.

The man who was once blind took a leap of faith and came to believe in Jesus. The Pharisees, who had no problem seeing Him, shut their eyes on Him. Their problem was a lack of belief, not a lack of evidence. "Believing is seeing." It's Christ's motto. It's our experience.

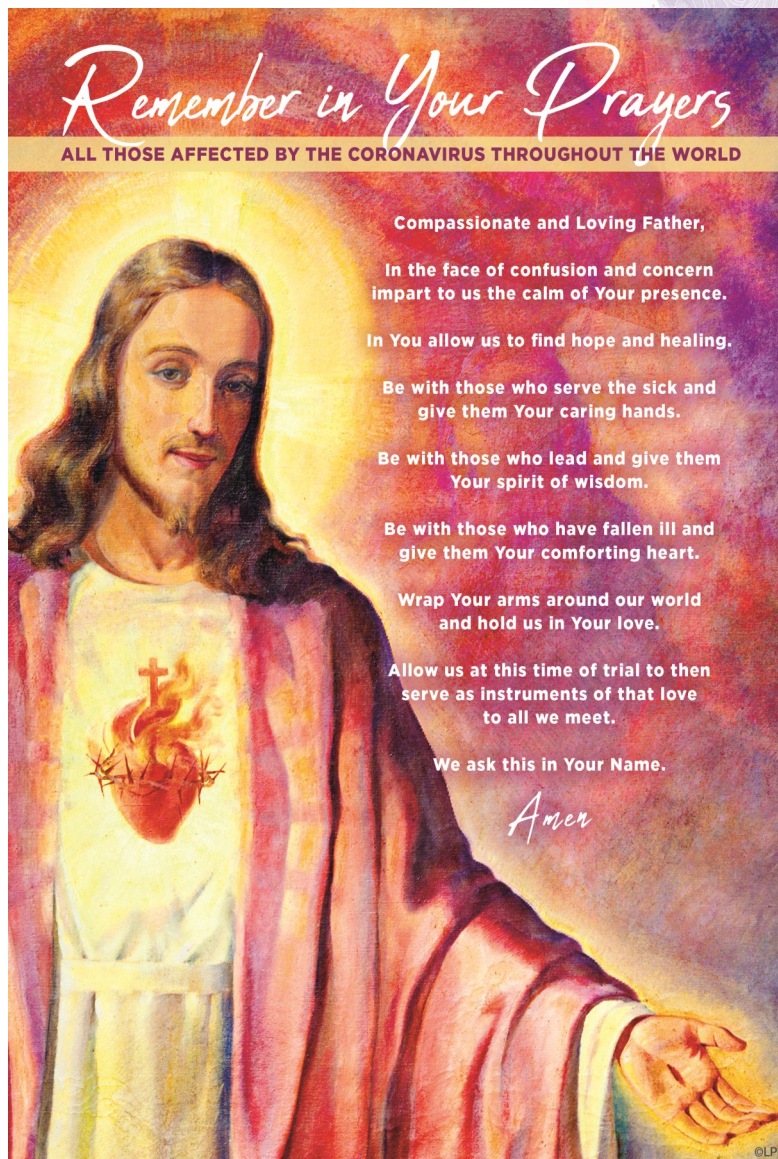

3 LISTEN TO A REFLECTION

4 REFLECT TOGETHER

Share your own thoughts about the readings/homily. What did you hear? What did God stir in your heart? How do these readings apply to your family?



5 PRAY

Who would you like to pray for today? Gather the intentions of your family, our world & community, and ask God to hear your prayer.

6 SPIRITUAL COMMUNION

Saints often made a spiritual communion when they couldn't attend mass. Receive Jesus into your heart. Ask Jesus to come into your life. Unite yourself to God in prayer. Close with the Lord's Prayer.

MORE FROM THE DESK OF FR. ALFONSE...

Dear All Saints Family,

As the news about the coronavirus pandemic becomes scarier, and national directives become ever more restrictive, it is understandable to feel some anxiety and sadness. After all, our lives are being uprooted.

"I'm scared."

I'm nervous."

"I'm angry!"

These are just a few of the many comments I've been hearing and receiving lately from parishioners and friends. Many adults are beginning to feel the financial pinch that comes from reduced work hours. Parents of younger children are facing the stress of having their children at home while they work. Thank God for grandparents! Young people are sad about their Spring Break plans being cancelled and spending it under lockdown, and the possible cancellation of graduation ceremonies and graduation parties.

It all seems so strange. No traffic. No public Masses. No appointments. No visits to the sick. We have been told by our health officials to wash our hands regularly; to stay at least 6 feet away from each other; and to refrain from having gatherings with more than 500 people. Whoops! It is now no more than 10 people!

The places we flock to – church, restaurants, fitness centers – are closed. What are we supposed to do?

This is Lent. And if we haven't yet decided what to give up, then the Lord (and other higher ups) have helped by deciding for us.

I miss seeing everyone! I miss seeing our All Saints families! But if we do our part to protect the elderly, the vulnerable, and all our loved ones, and avoid overwhelming our state and local healthcare facilities by lowering the COVID-19 curve, then all these

sacrifices will have been worth it.

Ah. There's that word – sacrifice. It always seems to pop up its annoying head. It's definitely present in bad times and, believe it or not, in good times as well. It seems to be everywhere! Like life, Lent is all about sacrifice. And where there is sacrifice, there is love because love and sacrifice are nailed together like Christ and the Cross... "till death do us part."

What sacrifices can we make during this time of Lent and during this unprecedented coronavirus crisis? Well, some sacrifices may surprise you.

1. Social Distancing. Spiritual Gathering. Christ spent forty days and forty nights in the desert. Although a fifteen-day lockdown or slowdown or quarantine may seem a bit strange, it's not something new. In the spiritual realm it's called a retreat. The word retreat says it all: stepping back. From what? From the world. The Trappist monks have been doing

it for 356 years. The Jesuits have a retreat center dedicated to it. Think of it like this: we have been given an extraordinary opportunity for personal prayer, meditation and contemplation. Do not think of this moment as scary, but rather as an unprecedented opportunity during Lent.

This doesn't have to be a lonely time. It's okay to spend it with family and/or very close or dear friends. Just remember: Everyone needs to stay put and no more than 10 people.

2. Washing our Hands. Cleansing Hearts and Minds. Water plays a huge part in physical cleansing. But let's not forget that it also plays a huge



part in spiritual cleansing. So maybe it's time to reflect on the healing story of Naaman, the army commander of the king of Aram (2 Kgs 5:1-15); or the early life of Moses (Ex 2:1-10), leader of God's chosen people; or the baptism of Christ (Mt 3:13-17), our friend and Savior. Water is all about renewal, rebirth, and redemption.

While confession is currently unavailable, there is

nothing stopping us saying an act of contrition.

My God, I am sorry for my sins with all my heart.

In choosing to do wrong and failing to do good,

**I have sinned against You whom I should love
above all things.**

**I firmly intend, with Your help, to do penance, to
sin no more,**

and to avoid whatever leads me to sin.

Our Savior Jesus Christ suffered and died for us.

In His name, My God, have mercy. Amen.
