FROM THE DESK OF FR. ALFONSE...



What is the fastest way to grow up? To embrace your cross and die to yourself. John's Gospel reminds us of the drama of life: life, friendship, death and resurrection. The Lord waited four days to return to Judea. He could have come sooner but he chose to wait and this was the Lord's friend! St. Theresa of Avila

reminds us of how the Lord treats his friends: he allows them to imitate him. Life, friendship, death and resurrection all play into God's amazing plans, but the prerequisites for all who wish to rise remains the same: Am I close to the Lord? Does he have my heart? Do I believe in Him?

St. John is not interested at all in describing the Lord's power to raise someone from the dead. He does not think like we do. Christ's miracles are not just physical. They are physical, spiritual, and psychological signs of conversion. They are pointers to something higher than the surface. We are to dig deeper or rise higher than we ever imagined into our

life. Lazarus comes forth, out of the tomb, with his body still wrapped and his face still covered in bandages. Why? Because he will need them again. One day, he will return to the grave. The time of the final judgment has not arrived. This is not the end of the world. This is a sign, a tiny little speck, or a precursor of God's amazing grace and love for us. What happened to Lazarus, friend and faithful follower of Jesus Christ, will happen to us. WE SHALL RISE FROM THE DEAD! But we must first believe and experience the Way of The Cross.

Why does the Lord demand faith? Why does he want us to believe in Him? Why is belief so important for a God so omnipotent? Belief means a way of life! The Lord calls us to believe; that is, to live like Him.

Heavenly Father, at the end of each day you give us a new day to die to self and to rise with Christ. Quiet our fears and open our hearts so that we love you more each day. We ask this through Christ our Lord.

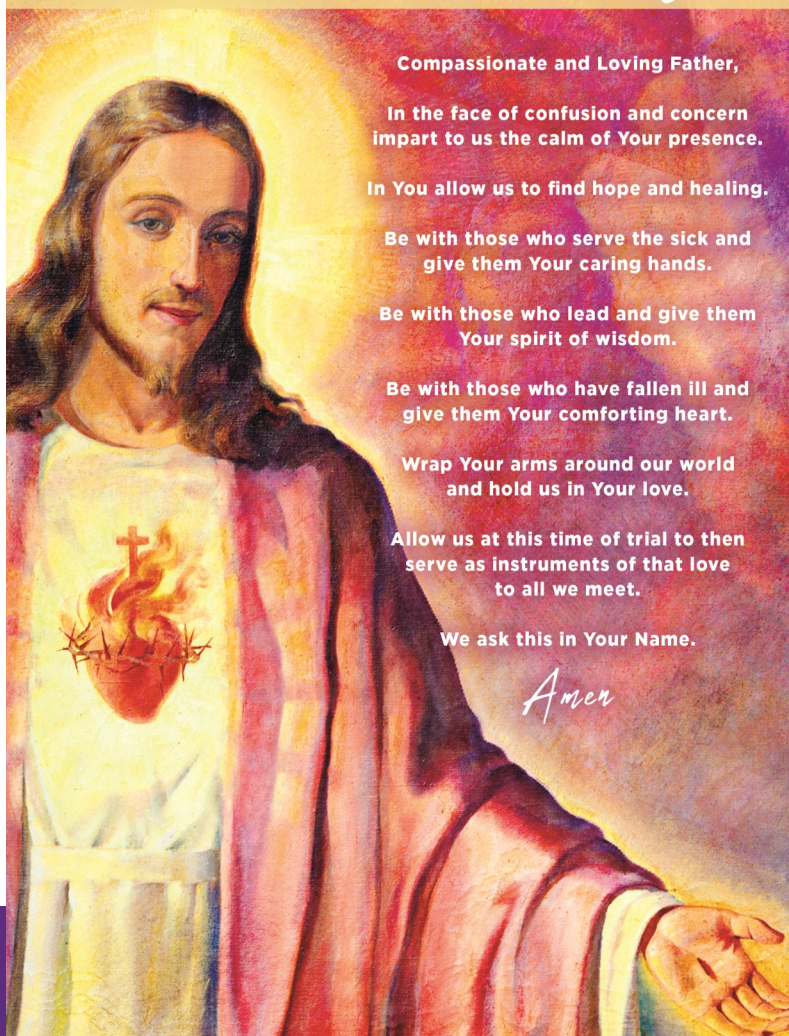

Shelter in Place Order.

(excerpts from the Diocese of Dallas Guidelines from Bp. Greg Kelly, Vicar General)

The Shelter in Place Order announced for Dallas County and taking effect Monday evening, March 23, is making it clear that restrictions put in place to mitigate effects of the coronavirus may well continue beyond Easter. With this in mind additional guidelines concerning Holy Week and Easter will be sent next Monday.

The "Shelter in Place" order for Dallas County affects only Dallas County. However, for the purposes of uniformity, these guidelines apply across the entire diocese.

In General

- There are to be no scheduled gatherings for any reason at the church or on church grounds during this time.
- Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is to be temporarily discontinued and parishioners given resources on the parish website for private prayer and spiritual communion.
- Scheduled Confessions at the church are to be temporarily discontinued.
- All Confirmations scheduled through the end of April are postponed
- Baptisms should be postponed except in emergency situations.
- Weddings, including Convalidations, should be rescheduled.
- Quinceañeras should also be postponed.

All of these guidelines are enacted out of charity, and concern that members of the Catholic community are kept safe, and do not become carriers of the coronavirus to others in our community.

Communications Update.

With the need to employ social distancing requirements set forth by public officials, the diocese and our parish leadership, most of the parish communications will shift to an electronic form. We will still print our bulletins, but with the ever-changing regulations due to the COVID-19 pandemic, what we showcase in the bulletin one day could be obsolete the next.

With that in mind, we introduced our COVID-19 Landing Page on our website. This will be a centralized area to view pertinent and theoretically up-to-date information about facility hours, email communications and social media outlets as well as provide links to live streams, videos and other resources to use as we employ our current social distancing requirements.

4 REFLECT TOGETHER

Share your own thoughts about the readings/homily. What did you hear? What did God stir in your heart? How do these readings apply to your family?



5 PRAY

Who would you like to pray for today? Gather the intentions of your family, our world & community, and ask God to hear your prayer.

6 SPIRITUAL COMMUNION

Saints often made a spiritual communion when they couldn't attend mass. Receive Jesus into your heart. Ask Jesus to come into your life. Unite yourself to God in prayer. Close with the Lord's Prayer.

All Saints Catholic School has transitioned to e-learning!

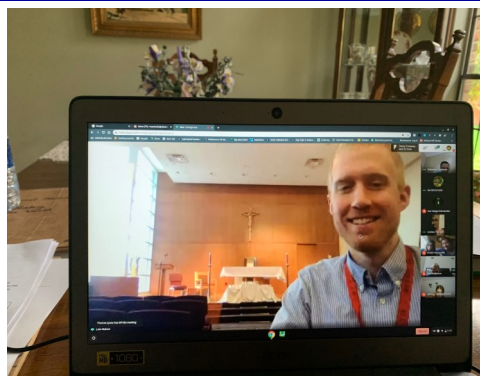

SPECIAL REFLECTION

MORE FROM THE DESK OF FR. ALFONSE...

On St. Joseph's Day, all families were invited to join the Holy Father in praying the Luminous Mysteries.

The Holy Father wrote: *"Mary – Mother of God, and Health of the Sick, to whom we direct the Rosary, under the loving gaze of St. Joseph, Protector of the Holy Family, and our families – brings us to the luminous and transfigured face of Christ and his Heart. We ask that the Lord especially protect our families, in particular the sick, and those who care for them: doctors, nurses, and volunteers, who risk their lives in this service."*

This was the celebration of the Feast of St. Joseph, a devoted husband and loving father. We do not know much about St. Joseph, but what we do know, is the most important thing to know: Joseph's will was aligned — to the greatest degree humanly possible — to God's Will. No matter how crazy things got in the household, or in town, or among friends and not-so-friendly friends from the Synagogue, or with Roman officials, St. Joseph did exactly what the Lord asked of him.

Is there anything else we could ever ask for in a person?

What exactly does it mean to align my will to God's Will? It means my heart and mind is united to God's heart and mind. It means what I say and do is exactly what God would say and do.

That's not easy. That's not easy at all. But it is important that we try. Why? What difference does it make?



The Holy Father has asked us to pray the rosary. Why? What difference will it make in the fight for our lives?

Prayer is important. It helps remind us of who we should be, what we should do, and how we should live. Prayer helps to remind me that the person across from me is just as important as the person across from them. For example, if I'm at a grocery store, I won't take 30 rolls of toilet paper. I'll only take

what I need and leave the rest for all the others that come after me. It means I won't have a one-year supply of ramen noodles or pasta in my pantry! It's unfortunate that businesses have had to post signs limiting the number of items a customer can take. I could go on and on.

What affects the physical world will also affect the spiritual world, just like a headache can ruin a day or a negative comment can make you physically ill. The COVID-19 virus has affected all of us, either physically and/or spiritually. Thank God, there is a vaccine for the spiritual: The great and last commandment of

our Lord (Jn 13:34).

There will be a vaccine for the physical.

Again, no matter how crazy things got in the household, or across the street, or in the neighborhood, or with the government, or around the world, St. Joseph did not waver from his commitment to the Lord and his family.

St. Joseph is a model of heroic virtue that we can all look up to and learn from.

St. Joseph, pray for us!
