

FROM THE DESK OF FR. ALFONSE...



Jesus said to his disciples: "You are the salt of the earth. But if salt loses its taste, with what can it be seasoned? It is no longer good for anything but to be thrown out and trampled underfoot."

These verses from Scripture are so familiar to us: "You are the salt of the earth. You are the light of

the world. Your light must shine before others, that they may see your good deeds."

But what exactly do they mean in today's secularized culture? What can Christians do to make a difference in the world?

Forgiveness. There's not a lot of forgiveness in the world today. Maybe it has always been that way. I don't know. But forgiveness doesn't come naturally, that's for sure. It requires a lot of faith, hope and love - putting into practice what Jesus preached. And while we may witness a lack of forgiveness among non-Christians, don't be surprised to find a lack of it among Christians as well. Why? Because we live in a very unforgiving society. We see it in the way we gossip about others. We see it in the way those who fall from "grace" are treated on social media, especially on YouTube videos, Facebook pages and tweets.

The Lord has given all Christians a great opportunity to be salt and light by sharing the Good News of forgiveness!

Love those who do not agree with you. Is it possible to love people who do not agree with you? I think it is, even if it is difficult. But isn't this something we can do for our neighbors? Isn't this something the Lord demands from us? Isn't this something we need to be sharing with others? I absolutely think it is.

I know how nasty some "tolerant folks" can be. I know how mean some "accepting people" can get. But we can never be this way. This is where we can make a huge dent in our society and a huge difference - as big as night and day - for Christ and neighbor.

I have experimented with this concept and I am proud to say it has never failed me. In other words, it has always worked. Loving those who do not agree with you pays off. You win their respect, their admiration, their appreciation and their time. You win their heart and ears and eyes. They warm up to you; they listen to you and they are glad to see you.

Try it. See for yourself. Once upon a time Christians were world famous for their ability to win over their enemies. Can we not do it again? How do you think they did it?

If you wish to be salt of the earth and light for the world, then love those who disagree with you.



IT'S COLD & FLU SEASON

This time of year is often called "flu season." In the United States, flu viruses are most common during the fall and winter months. Influenza activity often increases in November. Most of the time flu activity peaks between December and February, and it can last as late as May.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention recommends people seek out and receive the flu vaccine. The flu vaccine is recommended for everyone six months of age and older, including pregnant women.

STOP THE SPREAD OF THE FLU

- Avoid close contact with sick people and conversely while sick, limit contact with others to keep from infecting them.
- If you are sick with flu symptoms, CDC recommends that you stay home for at least 24 hours after your fever is gone except to get medical care.
- Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue when you cough or sneeze.
 Throw the tissue in the trash after you use it.
- Wash your hands often with soap & water or use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer.
- Avoid touching eyes, nose & mouth.
 Germs spread this way.
- Clean and disinfect surfaces and objects that may be contaminated.


