

## FROM THE DESK OF FR.ALFONSE...



What are temptations? They are invitations or choices that we can make in our lives. They are what they do not appear to be. They are hand delivered invitations to walk in a wasteland towards the Garden of Eden. That is, to follow a mirage in the desert.

Where do temptations come from? They come from the devil, our world and from our fallen nature. They do not come from God but are permitted by Him. And if they are allowed by our Lord, then they are for good reason. We can then turn to Him when we are tempted.

Temptations allow us to know ourselves better, what we truly love, what we are most attracted to. Temptations will never seduce me to do things I hate, like eat spinach! No, they know us better than that and know exactly when to hit, where to hit and how to hit!

So why does God allow temptations in the first place? Again, it's so that we can truly know ourselves. The Lord can use temptations to get the best out of us. It is a very strong reminder of his words, "Without me, you can do nothing."

The Saints that endured horrific trials and persecution are living reminders of God's fidelity to those who seek him. If they can persevere, so can I. If they can remain faithful in times of trial, so can I. Temptations can actually make us stronger. Every time I destroy a temptation, step on it, crush its head, I become stronger! It is a mystery. Why does suffering bring out the best in us? Why do we grow light years in maturity when we have to undergo hardship? It is a truth, a reality but a mystery. Temptations provide us with opportunities for growth because character develops with

choice. Humility and humiliation help us to grow "into" Christ. And when we grow into another Christ, we can begin to save.

How does the devil do it? He does it the same way over and over again. His way of dealing and wheeling started with Eve; his arrogance tempted Christ, and being unsuccessful with the Lord, he became very successful with us. First, he identifies the desire in us. He gets us to doubt (about sin), "Does God really care?" Then, he deceives us for he is the father of lies. He tries to get us to be like him: disobedient. The author, Peter Kreeft, writes that the devil goes for the legs, our lower faculties: emotions, desires, lusts. Christ goes for the heart and brain, the higher faculties: the intellect and the will. The devil shoots for the 60 yard dash, immediate gratification. On the other hand, Christ participates in the Marathon - the end of life, the goal, Heaven.

How do we destroy temptations? There are many ways, but the most important way begins with the right attitude. I must want, desire to eliminate temptations from my life. Sometimes we like to play with them, like with a killer whale, but temptations have no love affair with us. It is all business for them: seek and destroy.

Prayer unites us with God. Vigilance means staying alert, knowing the enemy well. Prudence means learn from your mistakes. Be honest with yourself. Know what you can and cannot do. Run, there is always a way out. Refocus – recommit yourself on a daily basis. Confess your sins immediately. Trust in the Lord. God is the great "I AM WHO AM". The devil is the great "I AM WHO AM NOT." Progress might mean baby steps. But don't ever forget, little by little means more and more. Finally, never give up.



Fr. Seán Charles Martin has been an educator since his ordination in 1981 as a priest of the Catholic Diocese of Dallas. He is a biblical scholar, much of whose work focuses on the letters of Saint Paul. Educated at the University of Dallas and the University of Notre Dame, he holds the doctorate in biblical theology from the Pontifical Gregorian University in Rome. In September, 2014, after having served for twelve years as Associate Professor of Biblical Studies on the faculty of Aquinas Institute of Theology in Saint Louis, he was appointed President of the Institute. On July 1, 2019, he returned to his first loves of teaching, research, and writing, and became President Emeritus of the Institute.



## **REFLECTION & PREPARATION**





#### **LENT... HOW DID THIS ALL START?**

When we approach the start of Lent on Ash Wednesday, we look toward a season of preparation, sacrifice and penance, culminating in Holy Week and the joyous celebrations of Easter. And while the liturgical season of Lent offers us a time for solemn reflection, it is also widely welcomed each year as an opportunity to be drawn ever closer to our faith.

But just how did this penitential season come to be? And how did the reverent hallmarks of Lent – such as fasting and prayer –become so deeply ingrained in our observance of this season?

To understand the Lenten season, it is important to understand the word "Lent" itself, which is derived from two Anglo-Saxon terms: lencten, meaning "spring," and lenctentid, which is the term for both "springtide" and "March" – of course, Lent often falls throughout most of the month of March, and during the transition into (and renewal of) the spring season. In Latin, the corresponding term for "Lent," quadragesima, refers to its dating from the 40th day before Easter.

This brings us to another hallmark of the Lenten season – its length of 40 days. However, Lent was not originally observed for this length of time. During the first three centuries of the Christian era, Easter preparations consisted of three days of fasting and prayer. In some places, this preparation was extended into the entire week prior to Easter – which we now observe as Holy Week. There is also some evidence that, in Rome, Easter preparation was as long as three weeks.

In its early form, Lent was an intense period of spiritual and liturgical preparation for catechumens who were to be baptized at Easter. At the time, many members of the community observed this period of preparation alongside the catechumens. But, as time passed and more people were baptized as infants, the connection between catechumens and Lenten preparation gave way to a focus on the themes of repentance and fasting during Lent for all Christians.

It was not until the fourth century – upon the legalization of Christianity – that Lent developed into its current length of 40 days, which mirrored the length of Jesus' fast and temptation in the desert, as chronicled in Luke 4:1-13.

And as the length of Lenten observance developed over time, so did the observance of fasting itself. At first, some areas of the Church abstained from all meat and animal products, while others made exceptions for certain foods, like fish. And while a person was to only have one meal a day, a smaller repast would be allowed so that manual laborers could maintain their strength throughout the day. Eventually, eating meat was allowed throughout the week, save for Ash Wednesday and on Fridays.

In fact, two of our most common and beloved Lenten and Easter traditions – the Shrove Tuesday meal and Easter eggs –developed from these early Lenten observations. Initially, abstinence from dairy products was observed during Lent, with dispensations given if pious works had taken place. Eventually, this particular rule of abstinence was relaxed entirely. Today, pre-Lenten pancake breakfasts, Easter egg decoration and egg hunts remain as enjoyable seasonal opportunities for fellowship and fun within our parish families.



# WHY ARE THREE SACRAMENTS RECEIVED AT EASTER VIGIL??


Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist are called the sacraments of initiation. For much of the first thousand years of the Church, people were confirmed immediately after Baptism and then received Communion at the same liturgy. For various reasons, the reception of these sacraments were split up and celebrated at different liturgies.

Approximately fifty years ago, at the Second Vatican Council, the decision was made to restore the initiation process of the early Church. That process is the foundation to the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults through which individuals are initiated into the Church. With the restoration of the catechumenate, Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist were again received in that order at one liturgy. When these three sacraments are received at the same liturgy, their connection is highlighted. People are completely initiated into the Church & adopted as God's own as they receive the Holy Spirit in Baptism and Confirmation, and are drawn closer to the Father through Christ in the Eucharist.


